This month Manager Tamie Warner and I attended the SWQROC Meeting in Charleville. Issues that were discussed included:

- programs and initiatives that would have the greatest impact and furthest reach to develop the South West Region.
- new federal programs and policies that would support Councils to build stronger communities in the future.
- as a member of LGAQ's Roads and Transport Advisory Group, and in light of Queensland's increasing road toll, I provided an update on the outcomes of the LGAQ meeting held on Friday 13th January in the lead up to the Ministerial Road Safety Roundtable on 24th January 2023.

Council is continually looking for ways to resolve issues surrounding housing and roads in South West Queensland and reduce the many challenges faced by rural and remote communities.

Acting CEO, Tiffany Dare and myself will be travelling to Canberra at the end of the month to lobby Ministers for solutions to issues facing the South West region with housing and roads high on our agenda. We will be petitioning for the establishment and implementation of a targeted and permanent funding program for rural and remote roads, which are critical to the productivity of the region and are still largely under-developed.

We will also be raising issues identified by the RFDS. I will be advocating for new funding models that are relevant to rural and remote regions to ensure people are not disadvantaged in our communities. Council will again be lobbying the Ministers to keep promoting, developing, and resolving issues experienced in the South West of Queensland.

On another note, we had our Men's night this month. There was a great turn out and a good time was had by all. I'd like to thank Council's Librarian & Health Officer, Diane Montgomerie and her team for organising the night. The hall looked really great! Looking forward to the next one!

RURAL SERVICES

Fish Surveys were conducted during the month by SQ Landscapes and Dr Adam Kerezsy.

Landholders gave permission to visit several sites along the Bulloo River, with fish identified, measured, and DNA samples taken for the

Department of Agriculture and Fisheries. Samples collected were all native

fish, healthy and of all ages.





Landholders inside the Wild Dog Barrier Fence have reported that sections of the fence have been compromised due to water flows and feral pig movements, allowing dogs inside the fence. Council's Rural Lands Officer travelled the fence from Nooyeah to Yakara and has provided photos and GPS location of problem areas to the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries Wild Dog Barrier Fence maintenance crew so repairs can be carried out







ROADS SERVICES

Crew 1 - This crew are still working on the TIDs job on the Quilpie Road. Work is progressing well, most of the sub-grad had been formed and approved by the Main Roads Inspector. The section now has the base gravel carted on it ready to spread once they complete all the sub-grade.

The crew have move away from the job for a short period of time to return to the Paroo River Crossing to repair this after the recent small flood. Not a lot of damage was done, mainly just washed the fines out and left rough stone. The crossing is schedule to be bitumen sealed on the 15 March 2023.

Council has had some delays on QRA Betterment work on the Innamincka and Warri Gate Roads due to difficulty accessing a stabiliser. Crew 1 will move out for a few days before returning to the Quilpie Road to complete this job in conjunction with the stabiliser. We are hoping to have this TIDs work complete by Easter.

Crew 2 - This crew have been on the Wompah Gate Road carrying out QRA flood damage works. Once they complete this road, they will then move back on to the Warri Gate road to do the LCRI and R2R work.

Crew 3 - This crew have completed the Thargomindah Streets widening project. These streets have now been bitumen sealed. This crew have now moved onto the Bransby-Santos Road undertaking QRA work. Once they complete this road, they will move onto the Orientos Road, followed by the Epsilon Road.

Crew 4 - This crew are currently completing QRA work on the Omicron Road. When this road is completed, they will move onto the Cameron's Corner Road QRA job.

Contractors have commenced:

- QRA work on the Toona Gate Road and will move on to the Oriento Road when this is completed.
- TMR RMPC Work on the Thargomindah Cunnamulla Road, gravel re-sheeting the shoulders.

The Concrete crew have a range of schedule projects:

- Warri Gate Road carrying out QRA work on concrete margins on floodways.
- Football Oval retaining wall and paths
- Culverts on the Bundeena Road (once approved by TMR)

Kim "Wattie" Norris started work on the Shire as the new Roads Manager on the 27th of February. Wattie is almost a local coming from Tibooburra so is already familiar with a lot of the roads and the area. Wattie is settling in really well and Robert Ferguson will be staying on for a while to help him find his feet within the Council.













TOURISM SERVICES

Morton Bay Caravan, Camping, 4x4 and Outdoors Expo was held from the 17-19 February, Erin attended this event representing our Shire with the Southwest Queensland Region of Councils Tourism Group. This event attracts around 20,000 people and is a great opportunity to advertise our region and events. Attending with the SWQROC group lessens our cost, is a great time to collaborate with our neighbouring shires Tourism Officers and helps draw people to the Bulloo Shire from the East coast, using Balonne and Maranoa shires as steppingstones. The ladies at the stand spoke to over 1500 people for the 3-day event and gave out 720 Explore Bulloo Visitor guides to potential visitors. Since Erin has returned we have had several phone and email enquires stemming from this event.

Attending these sorts of events provides a great opportunity for Council to advertise our region in person, attract more visitors and generate a positive flow on effect to our local economy.

Preparations for the Shearers Shindig is in full swing. Tourism have been working with Grants Officer Dan Roy on funding submission which we expect will support our event for the next three-years.

New digital town sign has arrived. This is a huge positive for our town and will be a beautiful addition to not only the presentation of our town but the ease advertising events and public notices as it will be as easy as uploading information from the Visitor Information Centre computers.

The seven new signs which will replace very old ones at Hungeford look fantastic. Tourism will be coordinating with the roads department and Hungerford Caretaker, Sheree Parker, to have them installed all in time for the new tourism season.

Tourism Officer Erin Lee attended the Outback Queensland Tourism Association's annual Muster in Brisbane on the 7 – 8 March 2023 . The idea of this Muster is an opportunity for all Tourism Officers and Tourism Operators to learn new promotional and advertising techniques from professional tourism development personal. It is also an opportunity to collaborate and advertise our region to potential tour operators and travel groups, including tour bus and flight operators.
