

Council had the honour of hosting the Queensland Governor, Her Excellency the Honourable Dr Jeannette Young AC PSM and Professor Nimmo for their first official visit to the Bulloo Shire and Thargomindah in early September.



Their itinerary included a visit to the Thargomindah Outpatients Clinic, where they met with staff, followed by a community BBQ. They also visited the Hydro Power Plant with Council, took part in a walking tour of Thargomindah, visiting our heritage sites and the Bulloo River and witnessed first hand the impact of the flood on residents.



MAYOR'S Message

JOHN 'TRACTOR' FERGUSON

Representing Bulloo at the 2025 WQAC Assembly in St George

In August the CEO and I travelled to St George to attend the 6th Western Queensland Alliance of Councils (WQAC) Assembly, joining local government leaders from 25 councils across western Oueensland.

The Assembly provides a valuable platform for collaboration, advocacy and strategic planning to address the unique challenges faced by our region.

I had the opportunity to meet personally with the Honourable Kristy McBain MP, Minister for Emergency Management and speak with her directly about the disaster recovery efforts in our community, sharing firsthand the impact and the ongoing work to rebuild.

Insurance Roundtable in Charleville

The CEO and I also travelled to Charleville to attend the Insurance Roundtable - an important regional forum focused on flood insurance challenges across Western Queensland.

The Roundtable brought together representatives from the six south west Queensland Councils, the Honourable Anne Leahy, Minister for Local Government, the Queensland Reconstruction Authority (QRA) CEO Major General Jake Ellwood and the Insurance Council of Australia, there were several major insurers, including Suncorp and RACQ also in attendance.

The discussions were focused on the challenges regional communities face in accessing affordable flood insurance, despite mitigation measures such as levees are in place. Council attended to ensure current, accurate information is incorporated into our flood study - supporting the case for fairer insurance outcomes. The Roundtable will meet again in six weeks to continue this work.

Emergency Services Recognised During Governor's Visit

During their recent visit, Her Excellency the Governor of Queensland and Professor Nimmo joined the community at a BBQ to meet and greet but also personally thank emergency service workers for their role during the floods. Special recognition was given to the Rural Fire Service, Queensland Police and SES for their efforts.









COUNCIL UPDATES

Here's a quick snapshot of what's happening...

Residential Activation Fund

Council was successful in its application for \$9.9 million to replace the Sewerage Treatment Plant in Thargomindah and also provide new infrastructure in Sams and Frew Street - opening up 24 new residential lots. Council is finalising designs to begin construction in early 2026.

Country Roads Connect Program

The Queensland Government announced \$5 million to Council to continue upgrading Warri Gate Road. Council will seal another 10km of road with this funding.

QRA Critical Access Links Program

Council has received \$3.5 million under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) Crucial Access Links Program to seal and fence the Noccundra Airstrip. Surveying of the strip is currently underway to finalise the design, with construction scheduled to commence in early 2026.

QRA Reconstruction and Restoration of Public Infrastructure

Council currently has an existing QRA submission of \$50+ million under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA). Following the March 2025 flood event, an additional submission of \$50+ million will be lodged, bringing the total DRFA-supported funding for road restoration works to over \$100 million. Works have already commenced on the last recent event, and tender documents are being finalised for upcoming projects.

Ratepayers of the Bulloo Shire are advised that rate notices for the period 1 July 2025 to 31 December 2025 have been issued.


Rates Notices for all properties within the Bulloo Shire are due 15 October 2025.

Public Notice – Council Housing Restoration Update

Council wishes to provide the community with an update on the progress of housing restoration works:

Funding Approval Received

Council has only recently received funding approval to proceed with the restoration of damaged Council houses. We appreciate the community's patience during this time.

Workers' Accommodation Complete

The workers' accommodation is now complete and tradespeople are expected to begin arriving next week.

Restoration Materials Arriving

Materials required for the restoration works are scheduled to begin arriving from 6 October 2025 for works to commence 13 October 2025.

Restoration Works Commencing

At this stage, two building contractors have been engaged and will commence restoration works. The contractors will restore five homes at a time, moving on to the next group of five once each block is completed.

Council acknowledges the challenges in securing trades for this project. As you can appreciate, 72 out of 77 local government areas across the State have been disaster-declared, creating an unprecedented demand for tradespeople and construction services.

We thank you for your patience and continued support as we work to restore homes and return affected residents to safe, secure housing.

RURAL & TOWN SERVICES UPDATE

Hungerford

The team have been kept busy removing construction waste from homes that have been stripped out and made safe as part of the flood recovery process. Roads Update.....

R.R.U.P. Section 2 - Warri Gate

- Council has completed 19.2km of sealing with 8 meters wide bitumen.
- Rock protection on floodway's is about to commence and expected to be completed by end of October 2025, weather permitting.

Roads to Recovery (RTR)

- Council has recommenced RTR construction works on Warri Gate Road.
- RTR will seal the problem sections where the road holds water.
- Sealing these sections will improve resilience and see the Warri Gate Road opened sooner following rain events.

COUNCIL ROAD MAINTENANCE

- Council Maintenance crew completed patching works along Innamincka Road just in time for the reopening of Burke and Wills Bridge (Nappa Merrie Bridge).
- Pothole patching has also been completed along Warri Gate Road from Bundeena T-intersection through to Ch.54.
- Vegetation Clearing has been completed along Hungerford Road
- Medium formation Grading on damage section on Bulloo Downs Road has been completed.

TMR RMPC (Routine Maintenance Performance Contract)

 Heavy shoulder grading is currently in progress along the Bundeena Road, with one Council crew actively working on this section.

TMR TIDS (Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme)

- Works had commenced along Bundeena Road to widen the narrow section to made it to 8 meters sealed section. These works are planned in conjunction with the RMPC Re- sheeting Budget.
- Council's TIDS allocation for the 2025-2026 financial year is \$1,070,000.00.

First aid fact sheet

Snake bite



All known or suspected snake bites must be treated as potentially life-threatening, and medical aid should be sought urgently.

Signs and symptoms

Signs of a snake bite are not always visible. In some cases, the patient may not have felt anything. Symptoms may not appear for an hour or more after the person has been bitten.

Depending on the type of snake, signs and symptoms can include some or all of the following:

- immediate or delayed pain at the bite site
- swelling, bruising or local bleeding
- bite marks (usually on a limb) that can vary from obvious puncture wounds to scratches that can be almost invisible
- swollen and tender glands in the groin or armpit of the bitten limb
- faintness, dizziness
- nausea and vomiting
- headache
- abdominal pain
- oozing of blood from the bite site or gums
- double or blurred vision
- drooping eyelids
- difficulty in speaking or swallowing
- limb weakness or paralysis
- difficulty in breathing
- occasionally, initial collapse or confusion followed by partial or complete recovery.

What to do

Pressure bandage & immobilise

- 1 Follow DRSABCD.
- 2 Call Triple Zero (000) for an ambulance.
- 3 Lie the patient down and ask them to keep still. Reassure the patient.
- 4 If on a limb, apply an elasticised roller bandage (10–15 cm wide) over the bite site as soon as possible.
- 5 Apply a further elasticised roller bandage (10–15 cm wide), starting just above the fingers or toes and moving upwards on the bitten limb as far as can be reached.
 - Apply the bandage as firmly as possible to the limb. You should be unable to easily slide a finger between the bandage and the skin.
- 6 Immobilise the bandaged limb using splints.
- Write down the time of the bite and when the bandage was applied. If possible, mark the location of the bite site (if known) on the skin with a pen, or photograph the site. Do not wash venom off the skin or clothes because it can assist identification.
 - 3 Stay with the patient until medical aid arrives.

Snake Safety Quick Guide

S If You See a Snake

- Stay calm and back away slowly
- Do NOT try to catch or kill it
- Keep children and pets away
- Call a licensed snake catcher

A If You Are Bitten


- Stay calm call 000 immediately
- Keep the person still do not let them walk
- Apply a firm pressure bandage over the bite and limb
- X Do NOT wash, cut, suck, or use a tourniquet

Safety Tips

- Watch where you put hands and feet
- Keep grass, wood, and rubbish clear from your yard
- Snakes are protected it's illegal and dangerous to kill them




Snakes usually avoid people – but if threatened, they may bite. Stay safe. Stay calm. Get help.




